2. A) Admission Criteria – Undergraduate courses

Courses to which the criteria below apply:

- Bachelor of Complementary Medicine
- Bachelor of Health Science (Acupuncture)
- Bachelor of Health Science (Myotherapy)
- Bachelor of Health Science (Naturopathy)
- Bachelor of Health Science (Nutritional and Dietetic Medicine)

i. Applicants with higher education study

Applicants with any previous completed higher education study will be required to provide evidence of this study in the form of an academic transcript and testamur.

Applicants with any previous incomplete higher education study will be required to provide evidence of this study in the form of an academic transcript.

If the higher education study was completed in a country other than Australia, the applicant must provide evidence that the qualification has been assessed as equivalent to an Australian higher education qualification.

If the applicant wishes to apply for credit for previous study, they must apply through the relevant Educational Pathways process as outlined below.

All applicants must attend a final admissions interview upon submission of their enrolment paper work. Admissions interviews may be conducted face to face, by other verbal medium (e.g. teleconference or Skype) or a combination of these mediums. At the completion of the admissions process an applicant may be directed to complete modules on the Learning Support Hub to support successful transition to study.

All applicants for entry to any College must meet minimum computer literacy standards as determined by the College and have unrestricted access to the internet and a personal email account.

Domestic applicants must be 18 years of age or turn 18 within their first semester of study. International applicants must be 18 years of age or older.

It is the responsibility of all potential students to read and understand the Inherent Course Requirements for the course into which they are seeking admission and accept the Inherent Course Requirements prior to initial enrolment in the course (where stated).

All applicants must meet the minimum English language requirements for their chosen course of study.

A valid Working with Children Check or equivalent (as outlined in the Working with Children Policy) must be supplied to the College prior to the student undertaking the relevant subjects in clinical-based courses. If the applicant knows of any reason why they will not pass a Working with Children Check, they should not apply for entry to these courses.

ii. Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study

Applicants with any previous completed VET study will be required to provide evidence of this study in the form of an academic record and testamur.

Applicants with any previous incomplete VET study will be required to provide evidence of this study in the form of an academic record or a statement of attainment.

If the VET study was completed in a country other than Australia, the applicant must provide evidence that the qualification has been assessed as equivalent to an Australian higher education qualification.

If the applicant wishes to apply for credit for previous study, they must apply through the relevant Educational Pathways process as outlined below.

All applicants must attend a final admissions interview upon submission of their enrolment paper work. Admissions interviews may be conducted face to face, by other verbal medium (e.g. teleconference or Skype) or a combination of these mediums. At the completion of the

At the completion of the admissions process an applicant may be directed to complete modules on the Learning Support Hub to support successful transition to study.

Admissions interviews may be conducted face to face, by other verbal medium (e.g. teleconference or Skype) or a combination of these mediums. At the completion of the admissions process an applicant may be directed to complete modules on the Learning Support Hub to support successful transition to study.

All applicants for entry to any College must meet minimum computer literacy standards as determined by the College and have unrestricted access to the internet and a personal email account.

Domestic applicants must be 18 years of age or turn 18 within their first semester of study. International applicants must be 18 years of age or older.

- Bachelor of Health Science (Nutritional and Dietetic Medicine)(Honours)
- Bachelor of Health Science (Western Herbal Medicine)(Honours)

i. Applicants with higher education study

Students entering Honours courses (research-focused) are expected to have completed a relevant Bachelor degree, and be able to demonstrate a GPA of 5.5 or higher in their undergraduate study OR be able to provide proof of research experience and potential equivalent to a score of 25 points from within the eligibility criteria (see Honours Application Guidelines for further details).

Applicants into research courses (i.e. Honours) will be required to go through an additional admissions process including submission of project plan / idea and supervisor selection.

All applicants must attend a final admissions interview upon submission of their enrolment paper work. Admissions interviews may be conducted face to face, by other verbal medium

(e.g. teleconference or Skype) or a combination of these mediums. At the completion of the admissions process an applicant may be directed to complete modules on the Learning Support Hub to support successful transition to study.

All applicants for entry to any College must meet minimum computer literacy standards as determined by the College and have unrestricted access to the internet and a personal email account.

Domestic applicants must be 18 years of age or turn 18 within their first semester of study. International applicants must be 18 years of age or older.

All applicants must meet the minimum English language requirements for their chosen course of study.

ii. Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study

Applicants who may not meet the educational requirements outlined above but who can demonstrate a lower level relevant qualification and experience in the field that indicates they would be able to manage the level of coursework required, will be considered on a case by case basis.

Applicants into research courses (i.e. Honours) will be required to go through an additional admissions process including submission of project plan / idea and supervisor selection.

All applicants must attend a final admissions interview upon submission of their enrolment paper work. Admissions interviews may be conducted face to face, by other verbal medium (e.g. teleconference or Skype) or a combination of these mediums. At the completion of the admissions process an applicant may be directed to complete modules on the Learning Support Hub to support successful transition to study.

All applicants for entry to any College must meet minimum computer literacy standards as determined by the College and have unrestricted access to the internet and a personal email account.

Domestic applicants must be 18 years of age or turn 18 within their first semester of study. International applicants must be 18 years of age or older.

iii. Applicants with recent secondary education (within the past two years)

Applicants with no undergraduate qualifications will not be accepted into these courses.

Applicants with no undergraduate qualifications will not be accepted into these courses.

3. Additional Information

i. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people

- Endeavour College of Natural Health offers scholarships for school leavers and gap year students of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent up to 19 years of age (full-time study only):
 - [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander School Leaver Scholarships and Bursary](#) - There are two Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Scholarships for school leavers and gap year students who are interested in studying the Naturopathy or Nutritional and Dietetic Medicine degrees. The recipients of this Scholarship will have the full cost of their tuition fees covered. Recipients will also receive a bursary of \$500 to cover costs associated with textbooks and tutoring assistance.

ii. Domestic applicants with overseas qualifications

Applicants seeking admission based on undergraduate qualifications from overseas must provide evidence that the undergraduate qualification achieved is equivalent to the relevant Australian qualification requirements for admission. Each State government has a separate Overseas Qualification Unit to undertake such assessments of qualifications; further information can be found here:

An applicant seeking admission who cannot provide documentary evidence of previous qualifications due to special circumstances (e.g. refugee) must provide a statutory declaration stating the qualification and the reasons for the inability to obtain the documentation.

iii. English language proficiency

Higher Education applicants for whom English is an additional language including permanent residents must have a grasp of the English language appropriate to higher education study, and will be required to show evidence of English language proficiency to a certain level depending on the degree and College entity. These levels have been set to ensure the student will have the ability to successfully engage in study in their selected field. Refer to the English Proficiency Policy – Higher Education for further details. At the discretion of each College, prospective students may be required to undertake an assessment of English language at their own cost and, depending on the course of enrolment, achieve a result at least equivalent to:

- Internet based (iBT) TOEFL score of 90.

All other Bachelor degrees at Endeavour:

- IELTS 7.0 (overall score)

- Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE 185-190)
- Pearson (PTE) Academic Score of 65 (overall score)
- Paper based (PBT) TOEFL score of 600
- Internet based (iBT) TOEFL score of 100.

All postgraduate / research courses at Endeavour:

- IELTS 7.0 (overall score)
- Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE 185-190)
- Pearson (PTE) Academic Score of 65 (overall score)

iv. Advanced standing / academic credit / recognition of prior learning – Educational Pathways

5. Enrolment

After all paperwork has been submitted and your enrolment interview is completed, you will receive a confirmation of enrolment. After enrolment is confirmed:

- International students must accept their offer of enrolment by signing and returning the Offer of Enrolment letter.

7. Financial Assistance

- Endeavour College of Natural Health offers two types of scholarships for school leavers and gap year students up to 19 years of age (full-time study only):
 - [Academic Achievers School Leaver Scholarships](#) - There are up to five Academic Achievers School Leaver Scholarships available, which cover the first year's tuition fees for any of our leading Bachelor of Health Science degrees or Bachelor of Complementary Medicine.
 - [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander School Leaver Scholarships and Bursary](#) - There are also two Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Scholarships for school leavers and gap year students who are interested in studying the Naturopathy or Nutritional and Dietetic Medicine degrees. The recipients of this Scholarship will have the full cost of their tuition fees covered and a \$500 bursary for additional costs (e.g. textbooks).
- Fee-Help – Domestic students studying any of our Bachelor degree programs may be eligible to access FEE-HELP, a tuition loans scheme offered by the Federal government. FEE-HELP allows students to defer all or part of the cost of their study and pay it off through the taxation system once they are working full time.
