The College aims to provide a holistic and innovative approach to supporting students identifying with specific needs to equally participate in their journey with Endeavour.

The Mission and Values of the Program are deeply linked with the Endeavour values of Student Centricity, Responsibility and Embodiment. The fundamental principle behind the program is focusing on the needs of the student; as the students registered within the Access and Equity Program (AEP) know the truth of their own situation better than anyone. Inherent in the AEP is the focus on responsibility—both of the student and that of the College and how this partnership can be of the most benefit to each other.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Access and Equity Program Endeavour's Access and Equity Program (AEP) is designed to assist all students to participate fairly in study and enhance their campus life experience. The Program incorporates students with disabilities and medical conditions; and students requesting any Special Adjustments. This is a free service provided by the Student Services Team and focuses on making small or big adjustments to support students throughout their studies.

Am I eligible for the Program?

All Endeavour students are eligible for the Program, regardless whether studying online or on campus. Students with a disability or a medical condition will need to provide documentation from a Health Practitioner during the application process.

How can the Program assist me?

Endeavour can assist students in many ways, and can tailor a plan that accommodates a student's specific learning requirements or access to campus life. This can include, but is not limited to:

- Academic support
- Individualised advocacy
- Adjusted teaching and assessment practices

It does not, however, compromise academic standards.

How do I apply for the Program?

Students can apply for the Program by contacting their Access and Equity Officers on each campus through Student Services. The Officers are available for confidential appointments to discuss individual needs either by phone or on each campus.

Do I need a permanent condition to be a part of the Program?

No. Accommodations are able to be made to any student who has a condition, temporary or permanent, which interferes with their ability to participate fairly in study, provided they are able to support their application with

relevant documentation from a health practitioner.

Can Endeavour provide me with exam or assessment extensions?

Students when involved in AEP can apply for extensions directly with their local Officer under certain circumstances. Students are still required to apply for Deferred Examinations as per Endeavour's Assessment Policy, however are able to support an Extension Application with Access and Equity documentation that is provided to the student and liaise directly with their local Access and Equity Officer.

If I apply for the Program, is any information I provide confidential?

All information provided to the College is treated with strict confidentiality. Any information you disclose remains confidential with your local Access and Equity Officer. A copy of a student's individualised agreement of adjustments will be provided to relevant staff members, without disclosing anything of a confidential nature.
